Community Services – what are TCCAP's community

services programs? Community Services staff provide participants with options to help solve their emergency food, shelter, health, housing, transportation and tax preparation issues.

With the continuation of CARES and CSBG grant funding provided to us in the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, TCCAP was able to continue to provide emergency help for families and individuals who were in crisis from job losses, school closures, and insecurity with household needs and expenses. We worked in collaboration with the local County Social Services, Bridges of Hope, Salvation Army, Rural Minnesota CEP, HRA's and alongside client landlords, utility companies, car repair shops, homeless shelters and many more local businesses who were not getting paid during COVID-19. We provided critical emergency help to over 548 clients allowing them to breathe a little easier and stress less during an exceedingly difficult time.

One family came to us who were victims of domestic violence, had to flee and found they could not keep their job. They were now living in a camper with four small children so they would not be located. The family was struggling to pay for propane to heat the camper along with all the other bills that were piling up while looking for decent housing and a new job. We and our collaborative partners were able to secure safe, secure and affordable housing for the family and pay past due bills so they were then able to look and find work to support the family.





Agency Source of Funds \$12,314,779





Agency Use of Funds \$12,386,953





Head Start, Early Head Start & Child Care Partnership Proposed Budget \$8,878,546





TCCAP Weatherization program

The weatherization program completed the fiscal year with 2,313,661.00 in funding. During the fiscal year 2022 we utilized the American Rescue Plan Act to provide an additional 977,495 for the communities of Todd, Crow Wing, Morrison counties. This additional funding allowed us to reach clients who were deferred in the past and provide weatherization services to more residents in the three-county area.



Veteran Solar Program: Helping Qualified Veterans with Extra Income

TCCAP has installed a Solar Array on the property located at 501 LeMieur Street in Little Falls. The solar panel generates clean solar energy, the savings generated from this energy creates a fund which is disbursed quarterly to 15 pre-qualified Veterans. Checks are then mailed directly to clients. The extra money clients receive is allowed to be used on everyday expenses.
